

Satchitananda and the Twelve Great Works

You will recall from the Mudrashram® Advanced Course in Meditation that Satchitananda must perform 12 Great Works before it can complete its Aeonic Mission, and return to its origin again. This webinar will reveal more about Satchitananda and about the 12 Great Works, and the big picture of where your spiritual development is ultimately going.

What Are the 12 Great Works?

We will begin by reviewing the material from the Advanced Course. We understand that you probably were so tired at this point in the class that you only cursorily grasped this material, and you filed it away somewhere very deep in your memory banks. Let us then go over this material again.

"At its core, the twelve great works are the redeeming of each of the ensouling entities of our nature, together with the liberation of the spirits that accompanied them, the purification and perfection of their vehicles, and the overcoming of all karmic impediments."

"These 12 great works are transformation and liberation of

- (1) The Soul Spark
- (2) The Planetary Soul
- (3) The Monad
- (4) The Astral Soul
- (5) The Supracosmic Soul
- (6) The Soul of the Bridge Path
- (7) The ensouling entity of T1
- (8) The ensouling entity of T2

- (9) The ensouling entity of T3
- (10) The ensouling entity of T4
- (11) The ensouling entity of T5
- (12) The ensouling entity of T6

[This incredibly complex array of the levels of being and their associated unconscious strata of the Great Continuum of Consciousness veil Satchitananda. Poet sages have referred to this obscuring effect of the unconscious as the webs of the mind, or Maya. Swami goes on to discuss how we are freed from these barriers within our own unconscious mind.]

"Because these webs of the mind are so intricately interwoven, it is nearly impossible to find one's way out of the morass. Therefore, someone who is awake must awaken the dreamer. The Initiate given this most precious task is the Sat Guru of T7—who has not only known the Satchitananda, but has returned it to its Original Home, [to] the Infinite Stage."

"Unless we are awakened, we sleep through the Ages. Let us [then] resolve, above all things, to awaken."

"The awakening of Satchitananda is the imparting of Brahma Vidya, or Divine Knowledge. This only a bona fide Sat Guru of T7, or his authorized representative, is authorized to do."

The class, you will then recall, went into the three ways to remember Satchitananda. Then you gratefully completed the class.

We would like to give you some additional information about accessing Satchitananda, which is drawn from the Satsang Program Home Study Course. This section details seven different methods for accessing Satchitananda; in the class you learned three.

Following the Vertical Thread to Satchitananda

Excerpted from the Satsang Program Home Study Course

“...Satchitananda dwells on highest Path of the Transcendental Sphere. In traversing the vertical thread to this height, you will also cross through the other Transcendental Paths. The table below shows the eight paths that cross into the Transcendental Sphere.

Path	Major Spiritual Teaching or Teacher
Bridge Path	The Mudrashram® System of Integral Meditation
Transcendental Path One	Subud
Transcendental Path Two	Sant Mat
Transcendental Path Three	Meher Baba
Transcendental Path Four	Teachings of <i>The Urantia Book</i> , Paradise Path
Transcendental Path Five	Eckankar™
Transcendental Path Six	The Path of Rainbow Transmuting Light
Transcendental Path Seven	Satchitananda, Brahma Vidya, Knowledge

“With the exception of the Bridge Path, the Transcendental Paths begin in the Transcendental Sphere. These are paths where Nada Yoga is the primary transformational technique...”

“While meditation upon Satchitananda is a key practice for disciples of the Seventh Transcendental Path, we recognize this octave of Being as a key landmark on the Path. Satchitananda has been introduced in various ways in the Mudrashram® teachings, and can also be encountered through other techniques.”

“The table on the next page shows these different approaches to this highest octave of Being.”

Method	Details of Technique
The Cord of Remembrance	Also called Remembering the Holy Name, this technique follows the subtlest breath into union with Satchitananda. This Nada Yoga method of the 7 th Transcendental Path utilizes the contemplative mantra of this domain to unite the attention with the spirit.
Revelation by the Guide	In the Mudrashram® Advanced Course in Meditation, you followed the Guide up to Satchitananda. This method begins with Guru Dhyana Meditation.
Advanced Raja Vipassana	Swami Prem Dayal first revealed this in the Raja Vipassana Workshop. This technique involves focusing the attention to monitor present time experience in several higher octave vehicles, culminating in union with Satchitananda.
Following the Thread	Taught in this Satsang Program, you follow the vertical thread from the Soul to each higher octave of ensoulment.
The Mystery of Astabakra	Discussed in the Mudrashram® Advanced Course in Meditation workbook in the Advanced Jnana Yoga section. This neti, neti (not this, not this) technique reveals the essential nature of Satchitananda beyond the apparent duality of waking and dream states.
Kaivalyam Laya	Upon Liberation (Kaivalyam) in any sphere, attention is frequently spontaneously absorbed in Satchitananda for a brief period of time.
Kundalini Arousal into the Transcendental Sphere	Awakening Kundalini Shakti to the 11 th degree, the Mahatma Stage, reveals the presence of Satchitananda. Stages of Kundalini awakening are described in the Mudrashram® Master Course in Meditation workbook and the Accelerated Meditation Program in the article, "Talk Given at Babaji's World Parliament of Religions, December 19, 1992."

“...Through [these] means you will [build a] bridge to the highest state of consciousness, the Satchitananda. [You need to] practice rising through your vehicles—from the ground state of awareness to your Soul, and then ascending on the vertical thread up to Satchitananda. Do this meditation until you can travel at will from waking state to Satchitananda. Once mastered, this will give you the freedom to access any level within you.”

Scenarios for Development of Satchitananda

Satchitananda (SCA) is the ensouling entity for the Seventh Transcendental Path (T7). It is in Creation to complete 12 Great Works. There are eight potential scenarios for its development, which are described below.

Scenario	How it unfolds	Comment	Examples
1	SCA opens T7 entirely and is liberated without completing the 12 Great Works	While this is theoretically possible, SCA could not maintain the liberated state without finishing the other works—it would otherwise be drawn back into Creation	N/A
2	SCA opens T7 entirely and is liberated, but returns to complete the 12 Great Works while the individual is alive	This was the scenario that Adi Sat Guru T, the Mudrashram® lineage founder, followed. After completing this, he went on to do scenario 5.	Adi Sat Guru T

Scenario	How it unfolds	Comment	Examples
3	SCA opens T7 to the throne of the T7 Sat Guru, but stops short of liberation	<p>As the T7 Sat Guru, he acts as the overshadowing and supervising Initiate for the lifetime of the individual chosen for this task.</p> <p>The living T7 Sat Guru develops one individual to be the lineage holder for this tradition.</p>	<p>Sri Hans Ji Maharaj</p> <p>Sat Guru Balyogeshwar Paramahansa</p>
4	SCA completes the 12 Great Works first, and then ascends on the T7 path and enters into Liberation	<p>This is the Great Plan that is established within Nature and Consciousness.</p> <p>The individual would complete work in the Subtle, Planetary, Transplanetary, Cosmic, Supracosmic, and one Transcendental Path. The individual then works from the Bridge Path to liberate the ensouling entities (EE) of the other Transcendental Paths.</p> <p>SCA then ascends in synchrony with the Soul of the Bridge Path (SOBP). When the SOBP is liberated, SCA completes the work on T6, and then journeys to the Infinite Stage.</p>	<p>This is the pathway set up by the Multiplane Masters of the Mudrashram® lineage to enable other individuals to complete the 12 Great Works</p>

Scenario	How it unfolds	Comment	Examples
5	SCA opens T7 and is liberated, comes back to finish the 12 Great Works, and then establishes a lineage of Multiplane Masters to extend that Mastery in the service of other beings, so they can also complete those 12 Great Works	This is the way the Mudrashram® lineage of Multiplane Masters was founded; Adi Sat Guru T, the Mula Sat Guru of the lineage, followed this track	Adi Sat Guru T
6	SCA opens T7 to a high level short of Liberation and the throne of the T7 Sat Guru, to play a role in the dispensation of the living T7 Sat Guru	These ones do not develop themselves either to Mastery or Liberation, but rather attain an advanced stage upon the Path, where they offer their powers in the service of the living T7 Sat Guru	These were the stations of individuals in the former Divine Light Mission, such as Mata Ji, Bal Bhagwan Ji, Bhole Ji, Raja Ji, and the Mahatmas, who supported the work of the T7 Sat Guru
7	SCA is developed below the Mahatma stage; one becomes a devotee and servant of God and the T7 Sat Guru.	When SCA is awakened, this is the most common scenario. Only very rare individuals reach the Mahatma stage or beyond	Premies, disciples of Sat Guru Balyogeshwar Paramahansa

Scenario	How it unfolds	Comment	Examples
8	<p>SCA becomes linked to the SOBP after completing work in the Subtle, Planetary, Transplanetary, Cosmic, Supracosmic, and one Transcendental Path.</p> <p>In rare cases, an individual unlinks SCA from the SOBP, and develops SCA to a high degree on the T7 Path, beyond the development of the SOBP.</p>	<p>This scenario is possible when an individual is established on the Bridge Path as their cutting edge of spirituality, but actively develops SCA beyond the SOBP.</p> <p>This establishes a state of imbalance.</p>	<p>This was exemplified in a former Mudrashram® student, who has since left the Path</p>

In scenario 8, the “breakaway” of SCA from its anchoring alignment with the SOBP is generally rectified in one of two ways:

- (1) The lineage stops SCA at a higher level, and allows the SOBP to catch up
- (2) The individual stops meditation practice, and karma gradually fills in the imbalance generated from this practice, so SCA and SOBP become realigned

Options Available to Awaken Satchitananda

There is no more powerful Path than T7. It is the first principle that came into Creation. It animated the other ensouling entities through the current of Alaya.

Once the blanket of karma descended—and with it, the dark night of nescience—SCA was linked to the cutting edge ensouling entity, and witnessed the experience of countless lives. Until the current of Alaya is withdrawn, SCA remains tied to Creation.

There are three major options available to awaken and develop SCA.

1. Awaken Satchitananda so it can consciously witness life – This is a state of enlightenment, but SCA does not move forward on the T7 Path towards liberation
2. Awaken and unfold SCA through giving Knowledge – Here SCA does unfold, but unless it has finished the karma related to the other Great Works, it may be limited in its potential development short of the Mahatma Stage—without special dispensation, as seen in scenarios 1. 2. 3, or 6—going beyond this state is extremely rare.

Complete the development of the ensouling entities that anchor the Alaya in Creation, allowing SCA to ascend with the Soul of the Bridge Path – This is the most time-consuming strategy; this is the one that the Multiplane Masters of the Mudrashram® lineage have adopted. While this option takes longer, it ensures that when SCA ascends, nothing will draw it back into Creation.

When Adi Sat Guru T journeyed to the Infinite Stage, he beheld the 12 Great Works in their entirety. He then completed each of those works, and then established a lineage of Multiplane Masters to enable other individuals to replicate what he had done. This inner journey, with his remarkable discoveries, is documented in the book, *Your Life Never Ends: The Original Revelation of Adi Sat Guru T*.

This teaching he brought to humanity is unparalleled in its scope of vision, and unique in its comprehensiveness. While other spiritual traditions open only one Path within one Division of Creation, Adi Sat Guru T's revelation allows one to potentially open *all paths*.

Those that study with us are introduced to the 12 Great Works in the Mudrashram® Advanced Course in Meditation. Once you attain the stage of a Multiplane Master, you can consciously complete work on every Path.
